

Race/Ethnicity of Fall 2019 Graduate and Undergraduate Students





State of Residence of Fall 2019 Graduate and Undergraduate Students

Students reside in 31 states.

Seventy-one percent (71%) of undergraduate students are from Ohio; 20% are from Michigan; nearly 4% are from Pennsylvania and the other 5% are from 27 states.

Seventy percent (70%) of the Graduate students are from Ohio and the other 30% are from nine different states, including multiple students from Michigan, Kentucky, and Tennessee.



Distance Education Course Enrollments

Duplicate count: A student is counted for each course in which she or he is enrolled.

Online: An online course is provided entirely through the College's Learning Management System. No onsite class meetings are required. Course testing and other methods of assessment occur within the online environment, although proctored in-person exams may be required.

Hybrid: A portion of the course is delivered online, and a portion is delivered face-to-face. Hybrid courses use the College's Learning Management System (Canvas) for the online portion of the course.
