





## **Distance Education Course Enrollments**

**Duplicate count:** A student is counted for each course in which she or he is enrolled.

An **online** or distance education course primarily uses the internet to deliver instruction either synchronously or asynchronously.

**Hybrid**: A hybrid course delivers instruction through land-based class meetings and the internet. A typical hybrid course is 50% land-based and 50% online. However, the online component may range from 40-99% of total class instruction.
